

Community Health Data Intern, Data and Learning Team

The intern will work 20 hours per week with at least one in-person day per week at Interact for Health's office. The intern will participate in activities structured to expose them to many of Interact for Health's current strategic priorities which include youth mental health and well-being, community power building, and policy & systems change. The intern will assist the Data and Learning team with compiling and synthesizing information, reflecting on impact, and translating insights into learning to support strategic goals. This position will allow exposure to key staff and programs in a variety of areas.

Responsibilities:

Data and Learning Support

- Support the implementation of organizational learning activities that help Interact for Health assess impact, learn from work, and inform strategic decisions
- Conduct time-bound projects such as literature reviews, environmental scans and collection/analysis of primary and secondary community health data
- Identify and summarize key findings from reports, research, and community health data sources
- Collaborate with the Data and Learning team, program staff, leadership, and grantee partners to implement learning activities that embed an equity lens
- Monitor national, state and local community health data and provide community health data collection and analytic support to Interact for Health's strategic goals, as needed
- Translate community health data and evaluation findings into actionable insights using plain language and visual formats

Minimum Requirements:

- At least one year of experience in social sciences (sociology, public health, political science, etc.
- If current student, good academic standing with a higher-education institution
- Ability to organize and interpret information from various sources (including reports, surveys, and research studies)
- Strong interpersonal skills and professional maturity
- Ability to think critically, creatively, and strategically
- Passion for and alignment with Interact for Health's mission and values
