Some Ohioans say Ohio law SHOULD be changed to PERMIT the State Board of Education to adopt Health Education Learning Standards. These Ohioans say that without standards, topics in health education are taught differently throughout the state, and there is no way to ensure that all students are learning skills related to healthy behaviors.
